

## **Checklist: Student Visa for U.S. Citizens (Spain)**

<ul> <li>1. Before applying for the visa</li> <li>□ Check your course duration: if it's more than 90 days → you need a Student Visa (Type D).</li> </ul>
□ Confirm the Spanish Consulate jurisdiction for your state (NY, Miami, Los Angeles, Chicago, Houston, San Francisco, Boston, Washington D.C.).
☐ Book an appointment at your Spanish Consulate well in advance (ideally 2–3 months before traveling).
2. Required documents  ☐ Valid passport (must be valid for your entire stay + at least 3–6 extra months, depending on consulate).
$\hfill\square$ National Visa Application Form (downloadable from the consulate website).
□ Official acceptance letter from TLCdénia, confirming enrollment in a full-time course.
$\hfill\square$ Recent passport-style photos (check exact size requirements with your consulate).
□ Private health insurance authorized in Spain, with no co-pays, deductibles, or waiting periods; full coverage for your entire stay; minimum coverage of €30,000.
□ Proof of financial means to cover accommodation, food, and expenses (bank statements, sponsorship letter with ID, or scholarships/financial aid).
3. If your stay is longer than 6 months  ☐ Criminal record certificate (FBI background check with Apostille).
☐ Medical certificate (must state you do not suffer from diseases that pose a risk to public health).



<ul><li>4. Proof of accommodation</li><li>□ Rental contract, invitation letter, or residence certificate in Denia.</li></ul>
<b>5. Fees and submission</b> □ Pay the consular visa fee.
□ Submit originals + copies of all documents at your appointment.
6. After your visa is approved  □ Pick up your passport with the visa at the consulate.
□ Travel to Spain on the authorized dates.
□ If your stay is over 6 months, apply for the Foreigner Identity Card (TIE) once in Spain.
